Students who don't read over the summer can slide backwards in all subject areas. The summer break offers great opportunities for students, and their families, to help improve reading and writing skills.

Each incoming 7th grade student is required to read at least one 2021 Caudill Award nominated book this summer. There will be a specific assignment for this book when the students return to school in the fall.

Seventh grade students may choose from the following list of books:

- *A Long Way Down is an outstanding book by Jason Reynolds. It includes graphic language and other more mature content.

This letter is included in the virtual backpack. We strongly suggest that parents read the same book as their child and discuss it together over the summer. Students are encouraged to keep a journal or annotate as they read.
