ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

<u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u> -- Dr. James Menzer reported that today was the closing on the district's purchase of the Foss property adjacent to Millburn Central. Mrs. Foss will continue to live in the house for at least a few more months. The Board will discuss uses for the property at future committee meetings. Other upcoming school activities include a meeting of the Educating Parents organization, a joint Board dinner meeting at Lakes High School, the first Middle School Activity Nights of the year, and the Millburn School District 24 Education Foundation Golf Outing.

<u>CURRICULUM DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> -- Dr. Cheryl Kucera said that NWEA testing is continuing this week, mainly with make-up tests for those students who were absent last week. The teachers will use the upcoming Institute Day to evaluate the NWEA scores and develop goals for the year.

TECHNOLOGY DIRECTOR'S REPORT -- Joanne Rathunde distributed a report showing how often parents and students are accessing Power School for individual student information. The site shows the last date teachers updated grades, and allows teachers to make comments regarding individual students and assignments.

<u>SPECIAL EDUCATION DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> -- Elizabeth Keefe reported that she has attended training sessions on new state reporting requirements. She and her staff are becoming familiar with how to enter and access data on the new software program.

PRINCIPALS' REPORT -- Jason Lind said Millburn Central hosted a panel of speakers on Sept. 11 to help students understand the significance of past events of that date. The event was planned by the seventh grade Social Studies teachers. He also discussed: an Early Childhood train ride trip on Parent Involvement Day; a math support initiative that is being piloted with first and second graders; an upcoming meeting with the Lake County Sheriff's Department to discuss an emergency safety plan; an upcoming Daily Herald article that will feature Millburn Central; a first grade field trip to Milwaukee Zoo; and the Middle School 24-Hour Challenge.
