### For new students not requiring special services, the following admission guidelines apply:

According to Illinois law, physical examinations are required of all pupils upon their entrance into special education, early childhood, kindergarten and sixth grade.

To be eligible for admission to the school, a child must be 5 years old on or before September 1 of the school term in order to attend kindergarten classes. Additionally, students entering the 1st grade must have attained the age of 6 on or before September 1 of the year they are to enter 1st grade. Exceptions to the policy are those students who have attended approved kindergarten programs in other states, or have attended a program approved by the Illinois State Board of Education.

The district provides a readiness screening program which is administered to all incoming kindergarten students. Upon review of the screening results with the parents, it is possible for the district to recommend an additional year of growth and development at home prior to entrance into kindergarten.
