<u>A</u>cademic progress as measured by MAP scores, is a tool that can assist students with keeping on pace for enrollment in college preparatory classes in high school.

Put forth the $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$ est effort possible. Active participation in class, timely completion of all assignments and a willingness to accept challenges will keep a student on track.

Chart academic growth. Compare your child's RIT score with the Target Spring RIT score to the left. Are they on the path to success?

Note: Scores for On Track for College and Career Readiness is typically about 3 RIT points above the typical Spring RIT target.
