JOB GOALS: To diagnose and collaboratively design remediation programs or

supplemental services for students displaying academic and/or social emotional difficulties.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Participates in the screening of students, including the selection and/or administration of screening instruments and procedures

- 2. Conducts valid intellectual, academic, and personality assessments to answer the referral questions using non-biased assessment procedures that are consistent with the identified referral questions
- 3. Participates in Problem Solving / Intervention Team meetings and participates in school level and district wide planning meetings
- 4. Assists in the collection and analysis of data from Problem Solving/ Intervention Team meetings for the identification and implementation of supplemental services
- 6. Meets with the IEP team to interpret assessment results, develop recommendations and plan educational strategies
- 7. Attends Annual Review/IEP meetings as needed
- 8. Writes formal psychological reports which include results and recommendations based on the assessments
- 9. Evaluates intervention outcomes by maintaining contact with persons involved and modifies strategies as needed
- 10. Provides consultation to parents, school staff and others
- 11. Serves as a liaison between the school system, home, and the community to enhance services to students
- 12. Plans and/or provides inservice training
- 13. Assists in crisis situations
- 14. Performs such other tasks and assumes such other responsibilities as assigned by the Director of Special Services
