

Schools in Lake county

- 23 schools using trimesters
- 8 schools using quarters
 - An additional 6 schools using quarters due to their alignment with their high school

Total of 36 schools:

64% using trimesters

22% using quarters

36% using quarters- including the additional schools

Survey Completed by K-5 Teachers at Millburn Central and West

- Trimesters
 - 21 votes
 - "This would allow for more accurate feedback for the first report card"
 - "I have spoken to other teachers in other districts that love this format".

- Quarters
 - 2 votes
 - No comments at this time

Data and Information from Thomas Guskey

- "For assessments to become an integral part of the instructional process teachers need to change their approach in three important ways:"
- 1. Use assessments as sources of information for both students and teachers

- 2. Follow assessments with high-quality corrective instruction
- 3. Give students second chances to demonstrate success.

Switching to Trimesters

- Allows the ability to block time for classes
- Fewer classes for students
- Allows more time for the teachers to dive into to
- topics
- Explore more topics in depth
- Get to know your students better
- Data will directly correlate with report cards
- Scheduling- problems with breaks (Winter and Spring)
 - Only have to deal with a beginning and an end 3 not 4 times

Switching to Trimesters

- The first report card would coincide with the first conference- the second conference would coincide with the second report card
- It will allow more time to demonstrate growth and to see if interventions are working.
- This will help us form "snapshots" for school wide improvement and growth
- We will acquire data three times a year
 - AimsWeb-
 - Fall, Winter and Spring
 - NWEA (Map Testing)
 - Fall and Spring
