Business Office Update March 13, 2012

TAW & Property Tax Update

- On a cash basis, we have now used \$1,000,000 of our \$3,000,000 TAW's. We accessed \$500,000 in December, 2011 and an additional \$500,000 in February, 2012. The district was able to make its March 9, 2012 payroll without additional borrowing. I will monitor the district revenues this month, but I anticipate a need to access the TAW line of credit later this month.
- Based on last Spring's tax collection, I don't anticipate any significant property tax revenue until June, 2012. Last year, we received no property tax revenue in March and April. In May, we received \$68,286.69. The bulk of the property tax collection occurred in June, 2011 where we collected \$4,792,249.06.

Health Insurance Renewal & Open Enrollment

- The district received good news on February 23, 2012 regarding the health, dental & vision insurance renewal. The net increase for Millburn District 24 based on current enrollment in health, dental, vision, life, & long term disability is 2.16% or \$30,319.
- The only change to the insurance for the new plan year beginning on June 1, 2012 is that the Cooperative will be moving the prescription plan for the PPO plan to Blue Cross/Blue Shield. The Cooperative currently uses a separate prescription plan provider. There are no changes in prescription benefits or co-pays.
- The total premium and percent increase for dental and health are listed below:
 - o Dental Insurance Renewal
 - Single currently \$38 will increase to \$40 per month 5.3% increase
 - Family currently \$112 will increase to \$117 per month 4.5% increase
 - o Health Insurance Renewal
 - Single currently \$679 will increase to \$693 per month 2.1% increase
 - Single plus Spouse currently \$1859 will increase to \$1896 per month 2.0% increase
 - Single plus Children currently \$1639 will increase to \$1672 per month 2.0% increase
 - Family currently \$2015 will increase to \$2055 per month 2.0% increase
 - o Vision, Life & LTD rates will not increase for the plan year beginning 6/1/12
- Open Enrollment for staff will be held during the month of April. Representatives from the Cooperative will be in the district on April 18, 2012 to meet with staff individually and answer questions.

School Lunch Program

- As a result of new Federal requirements, Illinois has chosen to fully implement the new guidelines for the 2012-13 school year with the exception of the sodium targets. Because of this change, the state would allow vendors to charge the "CPI-U Food Away From Home" increase of 2.9% plus an additional \$0.06 per lunch to implement the changes.
- After reviewing the requirements, our vendor has notified me that they are not able to offer us a renewal based on the increase allowed. The cost of the food required under the new guidelines (not including any labor) is approximately \$0.11 per meal.
- I have contacted Denise LeFever from ISBE so that the district can begin the bid process.

Transportation Funding Proposal

- As a result of the state budget crisis, ISBE met recently stakeholders to look at possible changes to regular and vocational transportation.
- The Illinois State Board of Education has proposed revisions of the Regular and Vocational Transportation Guidelines that include the following:
 - o Eliminates mandated regular transportation and makes regular transportation permissive
 - Allows districts to charge for transportation, but waives transportation charges for households that meet the free lunch or breakfast eligibility guidelines established by the federal government.
 - o Eliminates Flat Grant funding
 - o Allows depreciation for yellow school buses only
 - Changes the formula to be funded on a per mile/pupil cost. However, the formula includes a hold-harmless clause to help districts ease the transition to the new funding mechanism 75% in FY13, 50% in FY14; and 25% in FY15
 - o Beginning in 2014, regular and vocational transportation will be increase based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI)
- Currently, Millburn receives \$381,812 in Regular transportation funding
 - o If this formula was in place for the current budget year applying the 75% hold harmless provision, Millburn would have received \$340,180 resulting in a loss of \$41,631.
 - o If the formula had been fully implemented (FY 2016 provisions) for the current budget year, Millburn would have only received \$233,092 resulting in a loss \$148,719.

Update on Bond Refunding

- The first step to update our bond rating is in process. A phone conference presentation has tentatively been set for Thursday, March 15, 2012 with Standard and Poors Rating Agency.
- Once we have our bond rating, the process to sell the bonds will begin.

Medicaid Fee For Service Revenue

• A big thank you needs to go to Elizabeth Keefe and the Special Education staff that took on the additional paperwork in 2009 to bill Medicaid for eligible services that are provided to Medicaid eligible students. The district received the first check dated February 21, 2012 in the amount of \$27,669.52 for their efforts. These funds must be used to supplement district special education programs and/or facilities. The funds may not be used to replace district funds allocated to special education.

Draft Budget Calendar

- A draft budget calendar is attached for your review and discussion.
- I am proposing a September adoption date for the budget due to the uncertainty at the state level regarding funding levels and the fact that we may not have all of the pieces to the budget until mid to late summer. A September adoption will allow us to have a budget that reflects the most current revenue and expenditure projections.
