Subject: Curriculum Report

Toward the end of the year, many deadlines occur In the area of curriculum and accountability. Sometimes it seems that May is the busiest time of the year. Teachers begin to take inventory of all of the books and materials that are in their room. MAP testing is over so we are getting the information ready for the parents. Administrators are already planning for next year. They are setting goals, organizing staff development, and developing strategies to meet the needs of the students to come next year.

As we look forward to the next year, we are also keeping track of what is happening at the state level. Common Core Standards are in the review stage at the state level. Soon they will be going through a final read. I anticipate that teachers will be introduced to the new standards by October and will begin to look at our present curriculum to see how it aligns with the new guidelines.
