Subject: Membership in Ed Red

ED-RED Organizational Information

Mission: A united voice advocating for the diverse needs of suburban schools.

Vision: To be a premier education policy resource for Illinois legislators and ED-RED membership

We Believe:

1. In a comprehensive education system supporting life-long learning.
2. It is the responsibility of public education to support all aspects of student learning.
3. A local school district must have the ability to make educational and fiscal decisions appropriate for its school community.
4. The State must provide adequate financial support for all public schools.
 - o Funding for public schools must be stable, reliable, and predictable.
 - o The state must fully fund the additional costs for programs that support special education and at-risk students.
 - o All state mandates should be fully funded.

Strategic Goals:

1. To research, develop, and initiate legislation advantageous to member districts
2. To actively advocate for or against legislation affecting member districts
3. To engage school board members and school administrators in the legislative process
4. To communicate proactively with member districts
5. To develop and nurture collaborative relationships with state agencies, advocacy groups, and other organizations to accomplish mutual objectives

History

Established in the fall of 1971 by seven north suburban high school districts whose superintendents and board presidents met periodically to discuss mutual interests and concerns, ED-RED's present membership has expanded to include 13 high school districts, 75 elementary school districts, 1 unit district, 3 Special Education Cooperatives and 3 Intermediate Service Centers in Cook, Lake, and DuPage Counties. Legislatively, ED-RED's area includes all or part of 18 of the present 59 Senate districts and 32 of the 118 House districts.
